3. **Structure and Organization of the Faculty:** The Faculty comprises seven departments with working there 95 Professors, Associate Professors, and lecturers:

There are 946 full-time and 363 part-time students at the faculty.

Proper conditions for education were created at the faculty. Most classes are held in classrooms. Two of them are named after G.S. Skovoroda and O.O. Potebnya. Among faculty facilities there are a training TV studio and 2 classrooms equipped with computers providing access to the Internet. It makes possible to access global computer networks. Physical Education classes take place at the sports complex “Karazynskyi” and at the tennis grounds complex “Unicourt”.

Students of the faculty are free to use the funds of The Central Scientific Library of V.N. Karazin Kharkiv National University. Lending library subscriptions, reading halls and the Centre of Internet Technologies are available for students of the faculty.

5. The faculty trains students in 2 fields: Philology and Journalism. The field of Philology is divided into the following specializations: “The Ukrainian Language and Literature”, “The

Russian Language and Literature”, “Applied Linguistics”, “Latin and Classical Greek, Antique Literature”. The field of Journalism contains the specialization called “Journalism”.

The term of education for getting a Bachelor’s degree is 8 semesters. The students who show special skills for education and scientific work have an opportunity to get a Master’s degree. The term of education for getting a Master’s degree is 2 semesters provided that a student has a Bachelor’s degree.

Education at the Bachelor’s level ends with defending a Bachelor’s degree work. Education at the Master’s level ends with defending a Master’s degree work and a state certification examination.

6. **Academic calendar.** The academic year is divided into 2 semesters. The autumn semester lasts 18 weeks (1.09 – 4.01), the spring semester lasts 16 weeks (9.02 –31.05). The winter exam session lasts 3 weeks (5.01 – 25.01), the summer exam session lasts 4 weeks (1.06 – 28.06). Winter holidays last 2 weeks (26.01 – 8.02), summer holidays last 9 weeks (26.06 – 31.08).
